WINTER PARK, FL - January 24, 2010 - [Moore Dance Project](#) will present its highly-acclaimed dance epic, *Colours of Courage: A Celebration of Black History in America*, in partnership with [Trinity Preparatory School](#), located at 5700 Trinity Prep Lane in Winter Park, FL.
