



SUMMER CAMP SCHEDULE & CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

ELEMENTARY DANCE & ARTS CAMP (AGES 9-11)

All classes are conducted in accordance with the National Standards for Dance Education.

This beginner/advanced beginner camp for students 9 through 11 emphasizes the principles of ballet and modern dance alongside a creative curriculum that includes exploratory work in music, the arts and other dance forms. All camps run 10am to 2:30pm Monday through Friday for a period of three (3) weeks. **Students may participate in one, two or three weeks of camp** and each week culminates with an in-studio demonstration for family members and friends to attend and enjoy! The weekly camp schedule is as follows:

MONDAY, JUNE 14 – FRIDAY JULY 2, 2010

10:00 – 11:00 AM: Beginner/Advanced Beginner Ballet (Vaganova)

Proper body placement, flexibility, balance, alignment, strength and technique are achieved through *barre* and center floor work. Students will also expand their knowledge of ballet terminology and develop an appreciation for the history of ballet. **Dress:** All black dance attire with nude or black ballet slippers; no jewelry and hair pulled away from face.

11:00 AM – Noon: Beginner/Advanced Beginner Modern (Horton and Graham)

This class provides instruction in the fundamental mechanics and techniques of Horton and Graham-based modern dance. Emphasis is placed on the application and history of modern dance techniques, performance skills, musicality and spatial relationships. **Dress:** All black dance attire; footwear is not required. No jewelry and hair pulled away from face.

Noon – 12:30 PM: Lunch with dance film, presentation or music studies

During lunch, students rest and dine while expanding their cultural understanding of dance and music through age-appropriate dance/music film presentations, music-listening and dialogue sessions, and special performances from professional dancers. **Dress:** All black dance attire; footwear is not required. No jewelry and hair pulled away from face.

12:30 – 1:30 PM: Introduction to rotating disciplines of contemporary, jazz, hip hop and cultural dance

In these beginner/advanced beginner workshops, students explore the movement, artistry and history of contemporary, hip hop and cultural dance, including dance forms originating from Africa, Asia and Spain. **Dress:** See above, plus socks/sneakers for hip hop and jazz shoes for jazz.

1:30 – 2:30 PM: Concert Preparation (Monday – Thursday) and Student Showcase (Friday)

Students use this time to practice collaboration and critical thinking as they integrate concepts and skills learned during the day into a final showcase, to be presented at the end of each camp week. Friday showcases are open to family and friends. **Dress:** All black dance attire; footwear is not required. No jewelry and hair pulled away from face.

One-time camp registration fee (all students): \$20
Any single week: \$110
Any two weeks: \$220
All three weeks: \$300
